LOCATIONS We are headquartered in Carmel, Indiana. Carmel is home to Washington National and 40|86 Advisors, Chicago is home to Bankers Life and Philadelphia is home to Colonial Penn.

EMPLOYEES We employ approximately 3,400 full-time associates. More than 1,200 work in CNO Financial's headquarters in Carmel, Indiana.

CUSTOMERS CNO Financial's insurance subsidiaries provide more than 3.5 million policies to middle-income working Americans and retirees.

FINANCIAL POSITION CNO Financial is one of the 15 largest public companies in Indiana, with a market capitalization of \$3.5 billion. The company is financially strong and well positioned for continued growth. In 2016, CNO Financial reported:

- \$4.0 billion in revenue and \$263 million in net operating income
- \$2.01 of net income per diluted share, up 45% over the prior year
- 117% total shareholder return over the past four years
- Strong capital position, including \$264 million in holding company liquidity, allowing CNO Financial to withstand periods of market stress

Additionally, CNO Financial Group has earned 13 rating agency upgrades since 2012.

HISTORY The company's predecessor, Conseco, Inc., was incorporated in 1979, began operations in 1982 and became a public company in 1985. The company re-branded to CNO Financial Group, Inc. in 2010.
